

STRATEGIC ADJUSTMENT TO LANGUAGE AND PROJECT FRAMING IN RESPONSE TO ADMINISTRATION SHIFT FROM BIDEN TO TRUMP

April 2025

BACKGROUND

With the transition from the Biden to the Trump administration in 2025, there has been a significant shift in federal policy priorities and compliance expectations. Certain terminologies and project themes previously embraced under the Biden administration are now considered potential triggers for review, cancellation, or amendment of federal grants. To navigate this landscape effectively, state and local governments, as well as nonprofit organizations, must proactively adjust their language and project framing.

Recommended Website and Documentation Adjustments

Organizations should immediately undertake comprehensive reviews and adjustments of their websites, documents, proposals, and grant materials to remove or replace identified trigger words to ensure alignment with the new administration's policies.

Original Theme: Socioeconomic Equality Programs

- Revised Framing: Economic Growth and Community Development
- Example Adjustment: Shift language from "addressing socioeconomic disparities" to "strengthening community economies," highlighting workforce training, infrastructure development, and local economic resilience.

Original Theme: Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Initiatives

- Revised Framing: Talent Development and Merit-Based Programs
- Example Adjustment: Transition from DEI-driven programs to merit-based talent initiatives, emphasizing skill development, career advancement, and measurable performance outcomes.

Original Theme: Healthcare Access for Marginalized Populations

- Revised Framing: Strengthening Community Health and Wellness
- Example Adjustment: Adjust language to reflect "improving community-wide health outcomes" through broad wellness initiatives rather than focusing solely on marginalized groups.

Strategic Recommendations

- Immediate Website Audit: Conduct a comprehensive audit to identify and replace trigger words.
- Document Review: Update all active and upcoming grant proposals and communications to align with new language guidelines.
- Training and Communications: Provide internal training for staff on updated terminology to ensure consistency across all platforms and proposals.
- Engage Policy Experts: Continuously monitor administration policy shifts and adapt communication and funding strategies accordingly.
